FALL RECIPES

FALL TIME MULLED WINE

INGPEDIENTS

Vield: 6 to 8 servings

- 1 large orange
- 41/4 cups/1 liter red wine
- 11/4 cups/10 ounces brandy (more or less depending on how much kick you want)
- ½ cup dark brown sugar (or maple syrup)
- 2 cinnamon sticks
- 6 whole cloves
- 3 cardamom pods, slightly crushed

PREPARATION

Step 1

Using a peeler, remove the peel in strips from 1 orange then juice the orange. Lightly crush cardamom pods.

Step 2

Stovetop Method:

- · Combine all ingredients in a pot or saucepan set over medium heat.
- Gently bring the wine to a low simmer over medium-low heat. Do not boil. Heat for approximately 15-20 minutes, stirring occasionally.

Slow Cooker/Crockpot Method:

- Add all of the ingredients to a 4-quart slow cooker.
- Cover and heat on LOW for 1 hour, or until the wine is warm throughout.

Step 3

- To serve, carefully ladle into the desired number of serving glasses. Leave the spices behind for re-use.
- · Garnish with orange strips and additional fruit, if desired.





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
